

CMT Moves St. Louis Metro East Regional Office

Increased staffing needed to satisfy client demands prompts move to larger office in Edwardsville.

Crawford, Murphy & Tilly, Inc. (CMT) recently relocated their Edwardsville, IL regional office to a new location at 314 Wolf Street in the town's historic Leclaire District, a move made to accommodate the increased number of staff working from the Edwardsville office. CMT first established a regional office in Edwardsville in 2001 in order to meet increased demand for their services from clients in the St. Louis Metro East area.

Edwardsville Mayor Gary Niebur joined CMT President Brian Whiston at a ribbon cutting ceremony at the office that will house 15 employees. The firm consolidated its East Alton, IL staff, which specializes in construction management services, with the Edwardsville staff last year. CMT is currently providing engineering services for several road improvements in the area and is involved in various water and wastewater projects for the City of Edwardsville.

CMT first established a permanent presence in the St. Louis Metro East area in 2001 after acquiring M.B. Corlew & Associates, a firm that had served Edwardsville and the surrounding area for over 50 years. CMT had teamed with M.B. Corlew on a \$10 million wastewater project in the mid 1990s. The success of the project and the shared values of the two firms prompted the consolidation.
