The volunteers came out in support of the CMT-sponsored build day for Habitat for Humanity on July 12. In addition to supplying labor, CMT is also partnering on the project as a Habitat Team Builder.

Workers slogged through thick mud while hanging siding and installing soffit on the house being built in Eastview Estates in Springfield, IL. Despite heavy rains the previous day and the threat of more to come, the bad weather held off and the scheduled work day was completed.

The house under construction will be the future of home of the Redpath Family. Patty Redpath is a single mother of seven adopted children, ages 18 to two. Local Habitat officials described her as an ideal candidate for their organization based on her history of providing a safe and nurturing home for her children.
